

K-12 students participating in summer, in-school, and after-school research experiences in the marine sciences are invited to participate in the Ocean Scientists Meeting K-12 Day on Wednesday, 14 February 2018 in Portland, Oregon. The K-12 Day will provide a dedicated forum for students to present their own research results to the scientific community and learn about exciting research, education, and career opportunities in the marine sciences. This FREE program is held in conjunction with the Ocean Sciences Meeting, which is attended by over 4,000 scientists from around the globe dedicated to advancing the study of ocean sciences and shaping the impact it has on society.

**The K-12 Day includes:**

- complimentary one day meeting registration to attend scientific sessions and exhibits of the 2018 Ocean Sciences Meeting on Wednesday, 14 February
- presentation of the students' research in a dedicated afternoon poster session: *ED009 Ocean Scientists of Tomorrow: K-12 Student Session*
- attending scientific oral sessions in small groups with graduate student mentors, and an opportunity to learn about education/careers in the ocean sciences
- publication of the students' research abstract in the Ocean Sciences Meeting abstract database and program

Participating students will be required to submit at least one abstract (this can be a group abstract) by the extended abstract deadline, Thursday, 5 October. This abstract deadline only applies to *ED009 Ocean Scientists of Tomorrow: K-12 Student Session*. The student must be the lead author on the abstract and no late abstracts will be allowed.
