

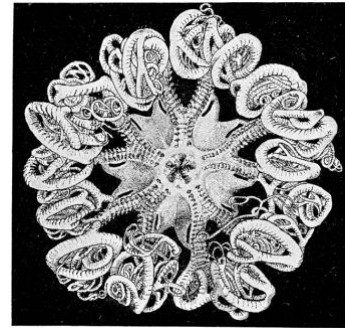
Geometry of Marine Invertebrates Basket Star Guided Research
